JERICHO ROAD'S GLOBAL HEALTH OUTREACH





In 2015, Jericho Road began providing global medical services by opening a health center in the Kono District of Sierra Leone, Africa. Since then, Jericho Road has opened three additional health centers in Africa - another in Kono District, one in the Democratic Republic of Congo, and one in the Port Loko District of Sierra Leone.

In August 2018, we officially launched a mobile medical outreach program in Nepal's Sindhupalchok District. This program recently became a full-fledged, stand-alone health center.

Our global health centers seek to improve healthcare access and services for all, regardless of economic, religious, or social standing. Jericho Road's goal is to assist local communities in developing sufficient healthcare resources and infrastructure in order for people to be healthy and whole.



SIERRA LEONE:

ADAMA MARTHIA MEMORIAL COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER

Jericho Road's Adama Martha Memorial Community Health Center (AMMCHC) opened in Kono District in February 2015 in the midst of the worst Ebola outbreak the world had ever seen. The center offers both inpatient and outpatient services with a focus on routine primary care. The center also provides sickle cell and malnutrition clinics for youth, some surgical procedures like C-sections and appendectomies, maternal/neonatal care, and spiritual care. In addition, the center conducts medical outreach to remote villages.

ORFONTHY COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER

Orfonthy Community Health Center (OCHC) opened in October 2017 in partnership with U.S.-based NGO EduNations. The center offers both inpatient and outpatient care. Many of OCHC's patients are students at the four schools in the Village of Rokassa that are operated by EduNations, but the center provides services, including deliveries and surgeries, to the wider community, as well.

JERICO ROAD HEALTH FACILITY, KOMAO

Located about an hour's drive from AMMCHC, this facility opened in June 2020. This clinic offers outpatient primary care and limited inpatient care. Vaginal deliveries are managed at this site and we look forward to being able to provide C-sections here in the future. We are working to expand this site with the addition of a pharmacy and surgical suite.

Health issues in Komao are exacerbated by poor sanitation and lack of access to clean water. Jericho Road is partnering with other NGOs to address these infrastructure gaps.

DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO:

THE WELLNESS CLINIC

Jericho Road's Wellness Clinic in Goma, DRC opened its doors in December 2016. It is located on the property of New Hope Center for Grieving Children - a facility for traumatized, grieving, and orphaned children, as well as widowed mothers and their children.

The Wellness Clinic delivers high quality primary care to the center's young clients, as well as to the surrounding community. The clinic also provides some surgical procedures, a malnutrition clinic, community health education programming, and maternity and spiritual care.

NEPAL:

JERICO ROAD NEPAL COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER

Located in the foothills of the Himalayas, the village of Hagam is highly isolated. Our newest global clinic opened here in May 2022, giving nearby residents a trusted primary care facility for the first time. Jericho Road continues to bring primary medical care by motorbike to nearby villages twice a month.
